Greetings WLMS!

Brrrr . . . Winter has arrived! We are glad to see students wearing hoods and hats to keep warm outdoors. Unfortunately, staff is needing to give a lot of reminders recently for students to take their hats and hoods off in the building. We need your support. Please remind your student(s) that hats and hoods need to come off in the hallways at WLMS. For safety purposes, we want to be able to see and identify all students in our hallways during transitions.

In addition, if your student brings a cell phone to school, please take a few minutes to refresh the WLMS Student Cell Phone Expectations:

- Students are expected to put their cell phones in their locker during class time. (There may be a few exceptions when teachers invite students on occasions to bring their cell phones to class for a specific learning activity and/or a personal cell phone is part of a student's specific learning plan.)
- Students may use their cell phones and electronic devices during lunch and recess, but use is not permitted in hallways at any time.
- Students may listen to music using one earbud during lunch and recess (but not in the hallways); only one earbud/headphone (not two) is permitted during lunch/recess for safety reasons.
- Students are not allowed at any time to videotape, audiotape or take photographs during the school day, including during the bus ride to and from school.
- Students who fail to adhere to this policy may have their property confiscated. Such property will not be returned to students, and will only be returned to a parent or guardian during regular office hours.
- Wilde Lake is not responsible for lost, stolen, or broken property.

8th grade Study Hall Program

Purpose: To complete academic work as a priority and in a quiet, positive, respectable manner.

The 8th grade team has decided to pilot a new study hall program for 8th graders. Study hall will occur once a week (on Fridays), in addition to tutorial. Study hall will be in a different academic class each week. Students should come to that class prepared with any materials that they need to work on. Study hall will be run much like tutorial, with one exception: **no passes will be given to visit other teachers.** The reason for this exception is that 8th grade teachers will be teaching their lessons and will not have time to stop to conference with a student.

The expectation will be that students work until the bell rings. This means that students will bring all necessary supplies to occupy themselves the entire class period. If student do not have assignments to work on, bring reading material or review other class material. Computers will be available **for academic purposes only** (not for playing games because there is "nothing to do").
