A special note from our GT Teacher, Mr. Doug Spicher. Our terrapins arrived on Monday! At present, they are both in one tank. On Oct 9th they will be moved into two separate tanks, one warm and one cool. Some background information -- we are participating in a study, collecting data for a professor at Ohio University. He is studying the effect of water temperature on the growth of the terrapins in the Chesapeake Bay. Our students are collecting growth data for this study. These data will be used by Dr. Wilem Roosenberg and his graduate students to determine the effect of rising seawater temperatures. The Terrapin crew has to keep everything the same including percentage of food given, air temp, basking temp and salinity of the water. The only thing that we have different is the temperature of the water. Kids are learning about animal care and they are learning patience. Each student involved in this program had to submit a written or verbal reason for wanting to be a helper and they were chosen based upon what they wrote. The terrapins will be released back into the wild when they are about the size of a 3 year old terrapin. In this way, we are giving them a headstart. The terrapin helpers will be invited to go on the release trip to take place in Mid-April or Early May. Next time you are in the building, stop into the Media Center and check them out!

We are making progress, but thirty percent of our students still need to have their Family File Emergency Card updated for the 2018-19 school year. Students will not be able to participate in field trips or after school activities if this is not updated. Parents, please take care of this as soon as possible.
