The annual **Hearing and Vision Screening** is scheduled for **Tuesday, November 5th** (rescreening on Wednesday November 13th). <u>All</u> 8th grade students as well as <u>new</u> students to the state of Maryland

will be screened per Maryland state law. Any student who is referred by a teacher for suspected vision or hearing problems may also be screened however a parent consent will be requested for these students.
