Transition words and phrases are used to make shifts between ideas, evidence and events. They establish clear connections and ensure that sentences and paragraphs flow together smoothly.

- **Tip 1.** Incorporate transition words while speaking. Have your child retell an event that occurred at school or over the weekend. Use "sequence or time" transition words/phrases to connect ideas together.
- **Tip 2.** When writing an essay or paragraph for a class, encourage your child to include appropriate transitions (see word bank below) between sentences and paragraphs.

To summarize:

To conclude:

Given these facts, hence, in conclusion, so, therefore, thus, to conclude

To indicate an example:

For example, for instance, in particular, particularly, specifically, to demonstrate, to illustrate

To indicate shift in time or to create sequence:

After, before, currently, during, eventually, finally, first, second, third, formerly, immediately, initially, lastly, later, meanwhile, next, previously, simultaneously, soon, subsequently

To compare and contrast:

Although, however, in comparison, in contrast, likewise, nevertheless, on the other hand, similarly, whereas, yet
