<u>School Wide Breakfast Program – Coming this Monday, March 7<sup>th</sup>!</u> - Last week, we shared with you that Wilde Lake Middle School is now eligible to participate in a school wide breakfast program as determined by the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE). **Beginning this Monday, all WLMS students and staff may receive a FREE breakfast every day.** There will be cold food choices daily & hot food choices will be offered two/three days per week. Mrs. Swartz & Mrs. Nunley shared some new morning logistics with students during the "WLMS Eye Opener TV Broadcasts" next week. Here is a synopsis of the procedures . . .

- **Students will go straight to homeroom** upon arrival to school (7:45), instead of stopping at their lockers.
- Breakfast will be delivered to each homeroom so that students can eat between 7:45-8:02. Our Eye Opener TV Announcements will begin at approximately 7:55.
- Students will now visit their lockers between homeroom and 1<sup>st</sup> period (8:02-8:04). They will have an extra minute during this class change.
- Due to allergies, we have shared with students that they MAY NOT bring in outside food for breakfast. They will need to either eat the breakfast offered at school or eat at home before they arrive to school. (If your child has a food allergy listed in their school health record, your child's homeroom teacher has been notified of all of the students that have known food allergies. Because ALL students will be offered breakfast, we want to make sure students are aware of their food allergies and know what foods they can and cannot eat. Please take a moment to discuss this with your student prior to Monday, March 7<sup>th</sup>, when the breakfast program starts. During an extended homeroom on the 9<sup>th</sup> ALL WLMS students will view a slide show presentation put together by the dental professionals at Chase Brexton Dental Clinic educating students on Oral/Dental Health and proper hygiene. Following this, the students who have been signed up (by a parent) to participate in this program will be screened (examined) and if it is found that the student is in need of sealants, these will be applied.

You, the parent, will get a notice that will be sent home with your student indicating what was found during the screening, what was done and if the student has any urgent dental needs. Please look for these notices when your student comes home from school.
