ATTENTION ALL PARENTS OF CURRENT 6TH GRADE STUDENTS!!'\In 2014 the State Department of Health and Mental Hygiene issued a list of new immunization requirements for all 7th grade students in the state of Maryland. *Effective the first day of school for the 2016 - 2017 these additional vaccines will be required for your student to attend school:*

1 dose of Tdap Vaccine (tetanus, diptheria, pertussis) **1 dose of Meningococcal Vaccine**

Many students may have already received these immunizations, but the Health Room may not have the **<u>updated</u>** immunization record. Please contact your child's health care provider and send or fax an **<u>updated</u>** copy of your child's immunizations to the Health Room. The fax number at Wilde Lake Middle School Health Room is 410-730-3275.

If your student requires additional immunizations, parents should contact their health care provider **as soon as possible** to make an appointment for the student to receive the required vaccines. Please provide the school with an updated copy of your child's immunization record, (complete with the provider's signature) once vaccinations have been completed.

Failure to provide proof of updated immunizations or appointment date to receive the vaccine within 20 calendar days from the first day of school (August 29, 2016) could result in your student being excluded from school. If vou have any questions, please contact the health room at 410-313-6957.
